

BSIS Admission

The freshman and sophomore years are spent in the College of Arts and Sciences or the College of General Studies. During your first two years, you can take courses needed for admission and that will satisfy the University-mandated Skills, General Education, Related Area and Information Science course requirements.

Upon completion of 55 credits (includes current term credits), students can apply to the Information Science program by meeting with their advisor and completing an Undergraduate Academic Program Change Form and a SIS School Transfer Application. Your advisor will submit all forms and accompanying information to the School of Information Science; it will be reviewed by the admissions committee. Decisions are usually made within two weeks. Deadlines: August 1 for the Fall Term, December 1 for the Spring Term, April 1 for the Summer Term

A student must have satisfied the following to be considered for admission:

- Completion of 55 credits (includes current term credits)
- Overall GPA at least a 2.75
- Information Science GPA at least a 2.75
- Completion of Introduction to Information Science (INFSCI 0010)

Other courses that can reinforce and aid your application. Discuss these optional courses with your advisor.

- Business Calculus (MATH 0120) Or Calculus 1 (MATH 0220) Or Discrete Mathematics (MATH 0400)
- Introduction to Logic (PHIL 0500) or Introduction to Linguistics (1000)
- Statistics (STAT 0200 or STAT 1000 or STAT 1100)
- Introduction to Psychology (Psych 10 or Psych 12)
